

4. Eucharist

When Jesus, who had died, was raised up to new life by God his Father, on Easter Sunday.	The holy day every week when the Jews rested from work and blessed God (a Saturday).
The Sacrament of the Eucharist.	The bread and wine that has been changed into the body and blood of Jesus, which we receive at Mass.
Usually short stories from the Bible, which are read in church, for example during Mass.	The body of Jesus, in the form of a consecrated host, which is kept in the tabernacle.

This means holy, or special to God.	To go down on the right knee, as a sign of reverence, for example before the tabernacle in Church.
The place where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in the church.	They live with God in heaven, singing his praise; some are sent as messengers, like Gabriel.
One of Jesus' followers.	A place where someone is buried.
