Select, decide, give informed opinions, conclude, debate, discuss, recommend, rate, reason, contrast	Justify opinions	Imagine you are asked to represent your school on a radio programme: 'Any Questions'. You are asked, "Does it matter which religion you believe in?" <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>State your opinion.</li> <li>Give at least four point to justify it.</li> </ul> [SB pp. 112-113]
Analyse, explain, investigate, compare, demonstrate, adapt	Analyse	Analyse the text p. 109 on Edel Quinn. Give examples of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>her faith,</li> <li>the challenges she experienced,</li> <li>the blessings she experienced.</li> </ul>
Compare, solve, show, use, illustrate, complete, classify, explain, demonstrate	Apply/Use your knowledge	Jesus has told us to, "Go out to the whole word and proclaim the Good News". Suggest ways you could do this. [SB p. 106]
Summarise, outline, interpret compare, reword, describe, give an example	Understand	What does St. Paul teach us about God's power?  Why is it important for us to know this? [SB pp. 104-105]
State, name, list, describe, label, recall	Know	What happened to the Apostles at Pentecost? [SB p. 104] How were they effected by this experience?
Repeat, label, recognise, imitate, talk about own experience	Recall	Who was St. Francis Xavier SJ? Where did he go? [SB p. 107]
