## THE WORD

Aim - Understand the idea of Jesus as Word of God.

Words are very important to poets. They try to put the right words in the right order to make perfect poems.

Words are the life force of poems. When the words have been chosen with care then the poem has more power.

Making the universe is a bit like making a poem. The words for a poem begin in the poets head. They are part of the poet. Then the poet takes them and puts them onto clean paper. The words in a poem carry a message.

Jesus was like a Word from God. He was such a powerful word that he needed no other words to help him carry God's message. Here is what St. John says:



"In the beginning was the Word; the Word was with God and the Word was God. Jn. 1:1

"The Word was the true light that enlightens all men; and he was coming into the world." Jn. 1:6
