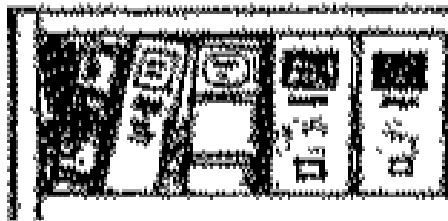
1 THE PROBLEM

IMAGINE that you have been given some shelves in a library. Imagine that you have been given the Bible – not as one book, but as a collection of all the books.



2 THE SOLUTION

- Your job is to arrange the books on the shelves in groups: *Law, History, Poetry*, and so on.
- You want to give people some idea of what's included in various parts of the Bible, so you should put information along the shelves. See the example below.



The first five books (or Torah). Find out about the Creation of the Universe, the Fall, the Flood and more ...

Read the story of how God chose Abraham and how God gave the Law to Moses.

3 WHAT YOU MUST DO NOW

- Draw your Bible library shelves, including information along the shelves.
- Get information from the lessons, from the back of the booklet, from other books your teacher may have, and from your own sources.
- You might want to include some pictures to help in your explanation.
