### Story of Franz Jäggerstätter

Franz Jäggerstätter was born in 1907 in a little village in Austria. He was quite a rowdy young man and didn't care too much for the Church, although he had been baptised a Catholic. When he married he calmed down and became more serious about his faith.

Meanwhile Hitler was calling up all young men from Germany and Austria to serve in his army and fight for Nazi Rule. Franz received an order to join the army. He refused to join because he believed Hitler's ideas and plans were evil. Twice more was Franz given orders to join the army. He still refused, believing in his heart that God did not wish him to be part of the Nazi war machine.

Franz was now a father of three little girls; his friends and neighbours told him to join the army. They all knew that Franz would be imprisoned and executed if he continued to refuse. 'Think of your wife and family' was the constant message. Franz loved his family dearly, and yet he knew that to serve in Hitler's army would be to go against his conscience.

Franz Jäggerstätter was imprisoned and executed for refusing to be a soldier for Hitler.
