Why do we pray the Angelus?

We pray the Angelus to remember when the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary with a very important message from God, she had been chosen to be the mother of Jesus. Jesus is truly God and comes as a human person, a baby. Mary said to the angel that she would do whatever He asked of her.

What do the words of the Angelus mean?

The words we pray tell the story and we repeat Mary's reply to the angel. It is like a conversation. The Hail Mary, reminds us again of Angel Gabriel's visit and also of Elizabeth's greeting when she welcomed Mary.

Verse 1: The Angel appears and gives the message, explaining to Mary that her baby will be special and the power of the Holy Spirit will be upon her.

Verse 2: Mary replies with perfect obedience and courage. She knew difficulties would lie ahead but she trusted completely in God.

Verse 3: Mary's response brought about the Incarnation. God came to earth as a real human being, lived, died and rose again.

In the final prayer, we ask God to help us live as Jesus taught us and pray that we will be happy with him forever in heaven.
